



It is important to understand that Girl Scouts has a history of promoting problematic resources to girls. Girl Scouts promoted pro-abortion resources to girls in the STUDIO 2B program, the Journeys series predecessor, that was used through 2009. In the book called "Focus: Uniquely Me! 


they use contraception.



Girls who are interested in learning more about different types of birth control, including the Pill, should talk to their doctors or other health professionals.

How Do You Get It?

A doctor or a nurse practitioner must prescribe the Pill. He or she will do a complete physical exam, which may include a pelvic exam. The doctor or nurse will often prescribe 3 months' worth of pills and explain when to begin taking the Pill and what to do if pills are missed.

The doctor or nurse will usually ask the girl to come back in 3 months to have her blood pressure checked and to see if she is having any problems.

If there are no problems and a girl wants to continue to use the Pill, the doctor or nurse will probably write another prescription for 6 to 12 months. After that, girls who are having sex should get routine exams every 6 months to a year, or as recommended by a doctor.

How Much Does It Cost?

The Pill usually costs between \$20 and \$50 a month, depending on the type. Many health and family planning clinics (such as Planned Parenthood) sell birth control pills for less. In addition, birth control pills and doctor visits are covered by many health insurance plans.

Girl Scouts USA books for girls: The Journeys series – some welcome changes to very offensive content

The pressure from concerned parents and media let to some welcome changes in the Journeys series. In February 28 2012, Girl Scouts USA released a list of changes to the Journeys program: http://speaknowgirlscouts.com/web documents/materialreview.pdf

While it is good that some problematic content has been removed or will be removed on reprint, some of this material was promoted to girls for years, since 2008. Why was it there in the first place and why did Girl Scouts wait so long to correct it? Unfortunately, even after the promised changes, much harmful content remains.

Samples of content that Girl Scouts promised to remove are:

<u>Promotion of literature that mocked the Catholic Church was removed.</u> Girl Scouts promoted Josefina Lopez and her play, Simply Maria, on page 50-51 of the book aMUSE for girls in grades 4-5. See the page scan from the Girl Scouts book here:

Recommendation of R-rated movies for movie viewing activity for 11 - 13 year old girls was removed. 



Labor Unions Oppose Anti-Choice Ballot Initiative

Feminist leaders successfully convinced California unions this week to take a stand against an antichoice measure that will be on the California ballot this November. If passed, Proposition 85 would amend the California state constitution to prohibit abortions for young women under the age of 18 – unless a physician notifies her parent or guardian in writing or she obtains a court order to waive the required notification. A similar measure, Prop. 73, was defeated by voters last year in a Special Election.





In 1966, Ms. Friedan helped found the National
Organization for Women, serving as its first president.
In 1969, she was a founder of the National Association
for the Repeal of Abortion Laws, now known as Naral
Pro-Choice America. With Gloria Steinem, Bella Abzug
and others, she founded the National Women's Political
Caucus in 1971.

Elizabeth Gurley Flynn b. 1890, Concord, New Hampshire; d. 1964, Moscow

Elizabeth Gurley Flynn was an American socialist, labor organizer, and activist for the rights of women and immigrants. As a leading member of the Industrial Workers of the World (IWW), Gurley organized strikes for textile workers; she also fought for freedom of speech and women's reproductive rights, including access to birth control. In the wake of the Red Scare, when thousands of leftists were jailed or deported for their political beliefs, Flynn became a founding member of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), established in 1920. In 1941, she was elected to the Communist Party's Central Committee. During the McCarthy period, along with other members of the party, Flynn was arrested and charged with conspiracy to overthrow the U.S. government; convicted, she served two years in a women's penitentiary at Alderson, West Virginia. She wrote about her experiences there in The Alderson Story: My Life as a Political Prisoner (1955). In 1961, she became National Chairman of the Communist Party, the first woman to head the organization. She died on a visit to Moscow; after a state funeral in Red Square, her remains were flown to Chicago for buria



WASHINGTON – Today, the Department of Health and Human Services announced all new insurance plans must cover the full range of FDA-approved contraceptive methods, as well as other critical preventive care like screening and counseling for domestic violence, without cost-sharing. This new measure makes effective birth control more affordable for millions of women by eliminating extra out-of-pocket expenses. The policies were recommended by an expert panel of the Institute of Medicine.

"Contraception is basic health care for women," said Laura W. Murphy, director of the American Civil Liberties Union Washington Legislative Office. 

Ms. Woods was the sole Democrat to win statewide office in Missouri in 1984, when she overcame a Ronald Reagan tidal wave to become lieutenant governor. She ran twice for the United States Senate in the 1980s.

While Ms. Woods was president of the National Women's Political Caucus in the first half of the 1990s, women scored significant victories as candidates. She pressed President <u>Bill Clinton</u> to name women to high posts in his new administration, which he did after complaining that


she was "a bean counter."

In 1982, Ms. Woods gained national notice when she defeated 10 opponents to win the <u>Democratic nomination</u> for United States senator, challenging the Republican incumbent, <u>John C. Danforth</u>.

Ms. Woods was the lone woman running for the Senate that year. Her unwavering support for abortion rights in a conservative state drew wide feminist support. Her slogan, "Give them hell, Harriett," was modeled on one used by her fellow Missourian President Harry S. Truman. She spent half as much as Mr. Danforth and came from far behind to





Suppose you and your team are animal and nature lovers and you want to help the environment, too. What animal or plant needs protection in your neck of the woods? Yes, even urban areas have plants and critters that need protection. So, what's threatened in your area? What's on the nation's endangered-species list? It could be a flying squirrel or a bighorn sheep, the California condor, a whooping crane, or even a crow. It could be the Texas prairie dawn-flower or the Willamette daisy. It could even be a spider. (Don't tell Dez, but about a dozen of her kin are on the endangered list!)

So huddle up and figure out who to talk to and who to meet—park rangers, local environmental groups, Nature Conservancy members, local Sierra Club representatives. Many people in your community are likely to be knowledgeable about plants and animals that could use your help.

In the Journeys series, Girl Scout USA consistently promotes their parent organization WAGGGS --- the printed materials tell girls they are "part of WAGGGS", they are "members of WAGGGS" and instructs girls to visit WAGGGS.org. The content on the WAGGGS website promotes "sexual rights for youth", emergency contraception, and comprehensive sex education (comprehensive sex-ed is complete information about sex, different sexual orientations, birth control, abortion, etc., all presented with NO mention of morals or values). Girl Scout History and Traditions



The First "Daisy"

Girl Scout Daisies might like knowing that their Girl Scout grade level is named for the founder of Girl Scouts, Juliette "Daisy" Gordon Low. Called "Daisy" by her family and friends, Low was well ahead of her time and known for her boldness and humor. She put no limits on girls' lives. Her nickname came from her uncle who, seeing her as a baby, said, "I'll bet she is going to be a 'Daisy!'"

The Girl Scout Law

Since its start, Girls Scouts has followed a set of values called the Girl Scout Law (or Laws). The original Laws were written in 1912. They were modified and updated in 1913, 1916, 1917, and 1920. A modern version of the Law was written in 1972 and the current Law was adopted in 1996.


Girl Scouts of the USA is a member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), which was formed in 1928. Daisies can receive the World Trefoil Pin, which symbolizes that they are members of WAGGGS. The pin is often given to girls on World Thinking Day. Its placement—above the Girl Scout membership pin—helps Daisies understand that WAGGGS is larger than Girl Scouts of the USA.

Traditions: Something to Celebrate

Celebrating Girl Scout traditions connects Girl Scouts to one another, to their sister Girl Scouts and Girl Guides around the world, and to the generations of girls who were Girl Scouts before them. A few Girl Scout traditions are mentioned here and also woven into the journey sessions. The Daisy journey also includes a new "tradition"—Hello Around the World, which offers a great way for girls


